

4th Sunday of Advent December 20th, 2020

The Lord God will give him the throne of David his father. (Luke 1:32)

It's almost Christmas! That thought can fill our hearts with anticipation. We might look forward to seeing friends or family. We can't wait to see the look on a loved one's face when they open the gift we carefully chose. Or we just want to enjoy celebrating Jesus' birth with our brothers and sisters in Christ.

But think about the anticipation that the Jews felt as they awaited the coming of the Messiah! Their hope was kindled almost one thousand years before Christ, when God promised David a kingly lineage. Imagine as well Mary's surprise when the angel described the son she would bear by using nearly the same words that God had spoken to David so much earlier. He would be called Son of the Most High, he would sit on the throne of his father, David, and he would reign over an eternal kingdom (Luke 1:26-38). Israel's long wait was over—the birth of Jesus would bring about everything they had hoped for.

modern-day Christians, As we don't experience the Jews' yearning for a Messiah, but we can still feel the ache of longing. For peace. For justice. For security. Jesus is the fulfillment of these yearnings too. When conflict—on a large or small scale—threatens to tear us apart, Jesus offers reconciliation and the chance to live once more in peace with God and our neighbor. When injustice breaks our hearts, Jesus tells us he has come to make all things right and to give us the strength to make things better in our own corner of the world. When insecurity makes us feel as if nothing ever remains the same, Jesus reminds us that his kingdom is everlasting; he gives us a sure foundation to build our lives on.

That's the kind of fulfillment that the kingship of Jesus can bring. That's what he promises. And that's a gift we can all receive this Christmas.



All Saints' Roman Catholic Church Updated as Changes Evolve

Thank you for your ongoing support during this period of great uncertainty. It has been wonderful to see so many of you at Mass since we were able to re-open in June. We are grateful to all the volunteers who have done an incredible job ensuring that our church was a safe place to gather; we are especially appreciative of their sacrifice and generosity!

As you are aware, the City of Toronto will move into "Lockdown Stage" as of Monday, Nov. 23rd, to help stop the spread of the COVID-19 virus. The lockdown order is in place for at least 28 days and may be extended. We recognize that this will be an extremely challenging time for many parishioners. So many of the faithful rely on our churches to find solace, peace and support in their lives, especially during this period of pandemic. We will make every effort to continue our outreach to you and to use technology to connect virtually with our parishioners.

What this means for All Saints' Church: Please note that this is an update from a previous communication and reflects the most current information from the Archdiocese and Toronto Health.

Masses – For Public celebrations, all weekday and Sunday Masses are cancelled. Communion on Sunday, as was originally communicated, is <u>not</u> available at this time.

Private Masses for Parishioners' Intentions: Father Glaba will celebrate daily Mass for the booked intentions of parishioners and for those affected by Covid-19. There will be <u>no</u> parishioners in attendance.

Confession: Parishioners wishing to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) can come every day from **Monday to Friday from 9:00 am to 10:00 am** or call the Church office and book an appointment with the secretary.

Private Prayer in the Church: The Church will be open for private prayer from 9:00 am to 11:00 am.

Masks are mandatory for the entire time you are in the Church. A maximum of 10 people will be allowed at any given time.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament: This Friday we will NOT have Eucharistic Adoration.
